About the artist

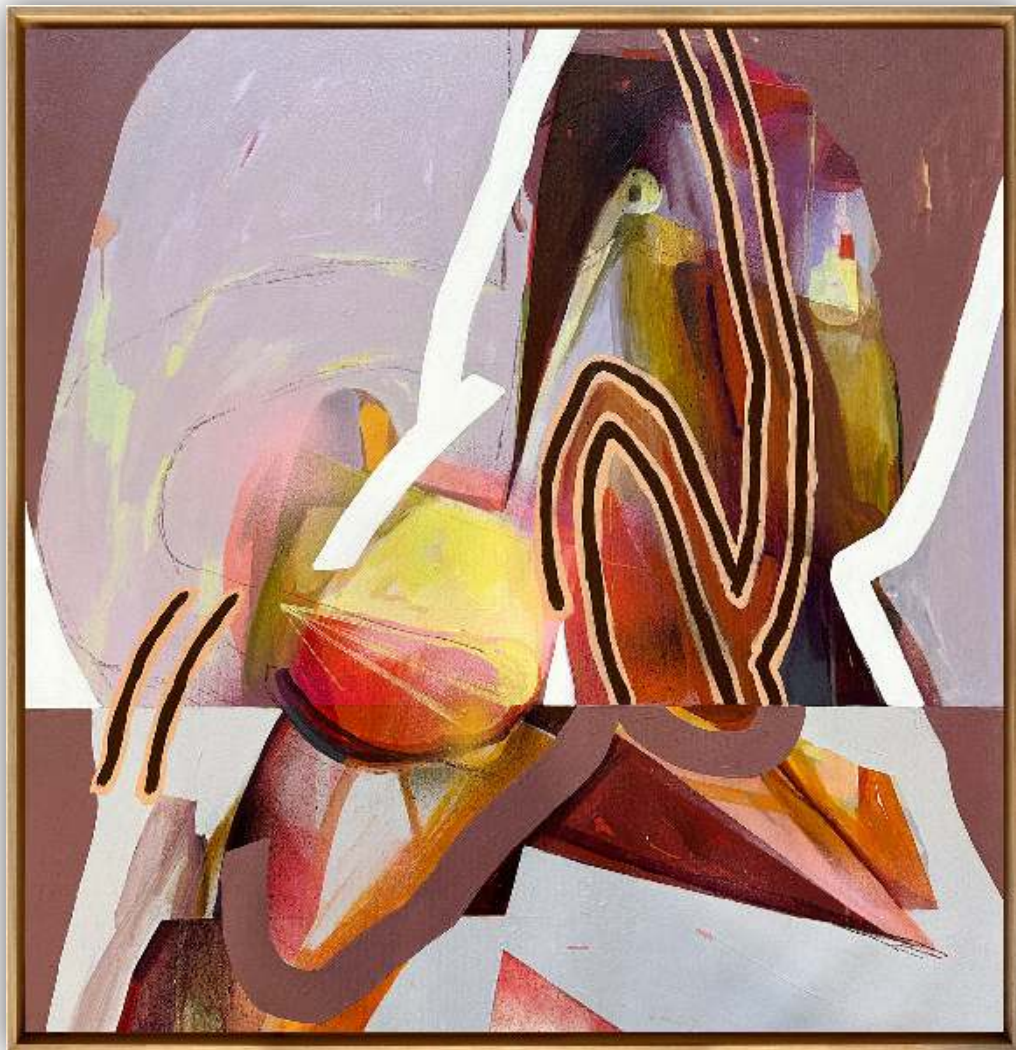
Feros (Serhii Hrekh, b.1992, Ukraine) is a contemporary Ukrainian artist based in Lviv, Ukraine. In his early career, he used the cityscape of Lviv as a canvas, creating graffiti works known for their bold use of color and shape. His raw and rebellious style gained recognition locally and beyond, with each mural telling a unique story inspired by personal experiences and societal issues. As Feros evolved as an artist, he transitioned from graffiti to abstraction and figurative surrealism. His works create alternate

realities, distorting familiar forms to offer viewers a unique perspective on the world. This blend of surrealism, personal narrative, and technical skill sets his work apart in the contemporary art landscape. In recent years, Feros's art has evolved with enhanced sophistication and complexity. Each color choice is intentional, evoking specific emotions and narratives. His work mirrors his personal experiences and background and presents a powerful commentary on society, culture, and the human condition.

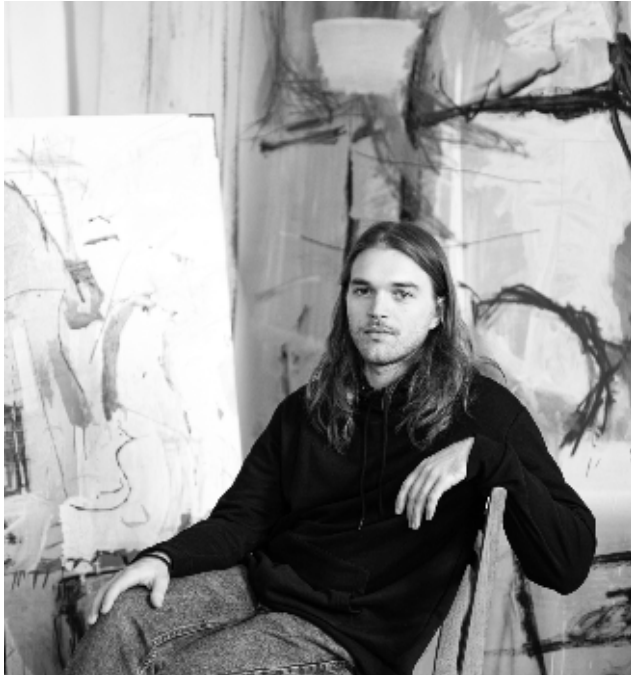

Eugene Lisniak

About the artist

Eugene Lisniak (b. 1994, Kryvyi Rih, Ukraine) is a contemporary artist whose mixed-media works celebrate Ukrainian heritage while exploring universal themes of resilience. Trained as a muralist, Lisniak combines oil, acrylic, and unconventional materials to create textured, vibrant compositions. His art has evolved as a powerful expression of resistance and hope, particularly amid

the Russian-Ukrainian conflict. Exhibiting internationally, including at Point of No Return in West Hollywood and Time of Potentially Endless Chaos at The Korsak's Museum of Ukrainian Modern Art, Lisniak continues to champion Ukrainian art worldwide, positioning him as a significant figure in contemporary art.

Liza Zhdanova

About the artist

Liza Zhdanova is a contemporary Ukrainian artist known for her emotional and thought-provoking paintings. Born in 1994 in Kropyvnytskyi and raised in Zaporizhzhia, she grew up in a family of doctors. She later studied monumental painting at the Lviv National Academy of Arts, where she developed her artistic voice. Liza's paintings focus on deep personal themes, including life, death, and memory. She believes that art should be honest and emotional. Her work often explores everyday moments, nostalgia, and human experiences. She paints large canvases using bright colors and simple shapes, creating art that invites people to reflect on their own emotions and memories.

One of her main ideas is that art does not need to be complicated to be meaningful. She believes that even simple images can hold strong emotions. Her paintings often include symbols and abstract forms, allowing viewers to find their own meaning in her work. She is interested in the connection between personal stories and universal themes, showing how emotions and memories shape our lives. Liza has exhibited her work in numerous exhibitions in Ukraine, USA, Europe, and she continues to expand her presence in the contemporary art world. She hopes to bring Ukrainian art to a wider audience and contribute to its recognition on a global scale.

Iryna Maksymova

About the artist

Iryna Maksymova, born in Kolomyia, Ukraine, in 1991, is a figurative artist inspired by Ukrainian Neo-Primitivism and Mariya Pryimachenko's imaginative style. Her vivid works combine personal emotions with cultural stories, often featuring powerful, nude female figures that symbolize strength and resilience. Animals, from pets to mythical

creatures, play key roles as guardians and symbols of values. Using bold strokes, spray paint, and eclectic text, Maksymova addresses feminism, human rights, and equality. Her art merges activism and storytelling, challenging norms while celebrating empowerment, justice, and Ukrainian heritage.

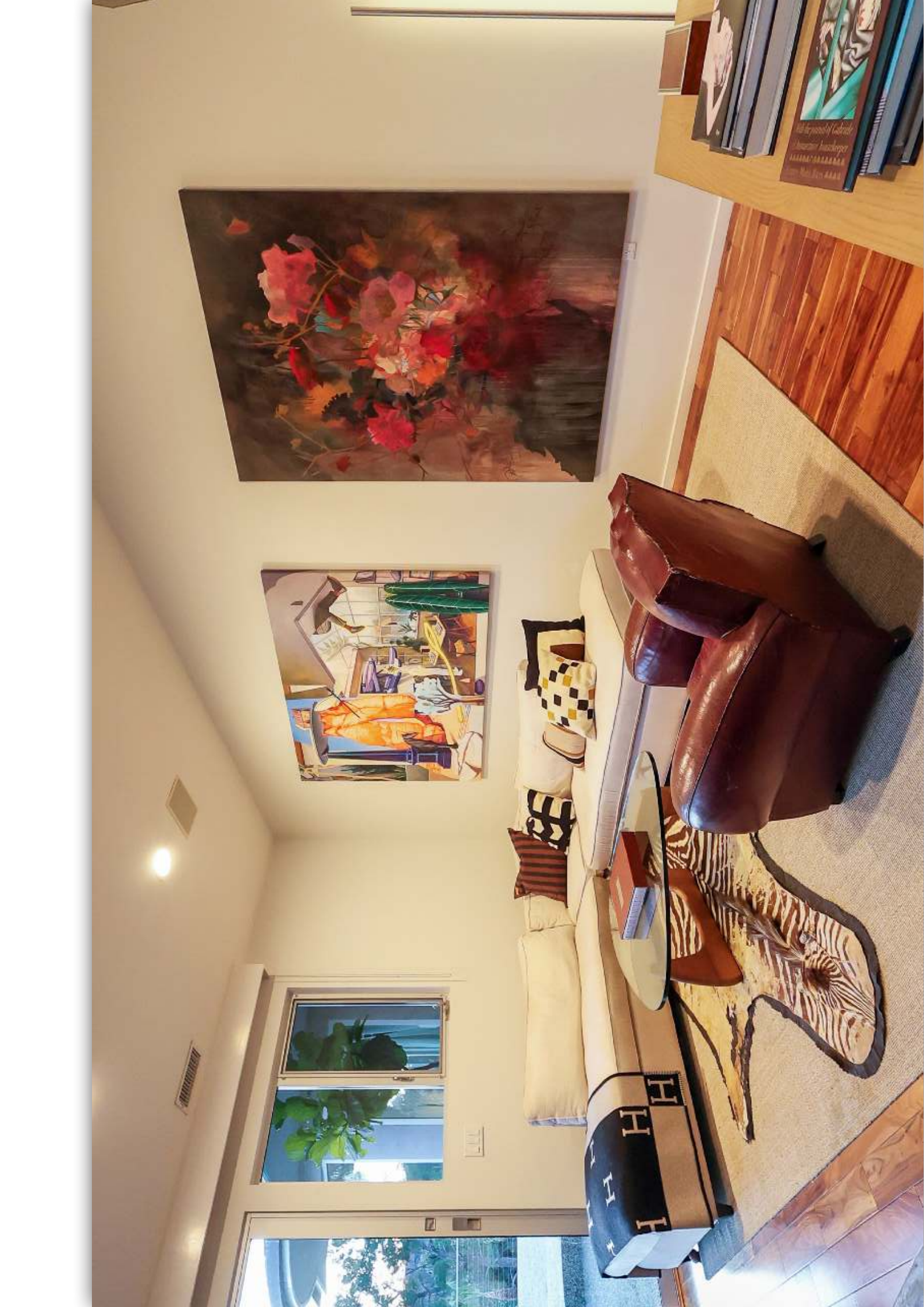
